Listed from lightest in body to more full bodied

Savoie, Abymes, 2011, Vin de Savoie, **France** 28
A perfect Oyster wine. High acidity, characteristic of cool climate vines. Quite herbaceous, shows aromas of freshly-cut grass, green apples & pears

Muscadet, Sevre & Maine, Marquis De Goulaine, 2009, Loire Valley France 27
distinctive and delightful bouquet, which combines with a hint of gunflint and musk on the palate

Gewurztraminer, Trimbach, 2009, Alsace, **France** 38
Flavors of lychee and some exotic fruits and finishes dry and spicy. Gewurztraminer should be drunk with spicy foods from all around the world

Can Feixes, Huguet, "Blanc Selecció" 2011, Penedes, **Spain** 35
The native Montonec (Parellada) produces very small, tight-bunched grapes of great structure & aroma, scents of citrus, gravel, minerals & wild flowers

Verdejo, Naia, 2011, Rueda, **Spain** 26
Aromas of lime, must and kiwi, together with the classic plant-like qualities of Verdejo. Beautifully fresh, with a long and dry finish

Gruner Veltliner, Huber, "Hugo", 2011, Niederösterreich, **Austria** 22
Flavors consistent with the nose, crisp citrus and a hint of green pea; tart acidity and bone-dry. A simpler-style GV but clean and fresh, fine with food

Pinot Grigio, Ca'Donini, 2009, Delle Venezie, **Italy** 26
Distinctive bouquet of wild flowers and hints of honey and fruit. In the mouth, the wine is dry and light with clean, lively apple and pear fruit.

Moscofilero, Skouras, 2011, Peloponnese, **Greece** 32
Bright, joyful acidity that is positively refreshing leads on to a surprisingly long finish of orange rind and a whisper of white pepper

Pinot Grigio, Alois Lageder, 2011, Alto Adige, **Italy** 37
Quite pronounced & expressive aroma with flowery & somewhat spicy notes. Rich flavored in the mouth, with slight smokiness at the back & a fresh finish

Pinot Grigio, Livio Felluga, 2010, Collio, **Italy** 47
Straw yellow with light copper hues. Fresh, silky, with good balance; excellent retro-nasal aromatics; mineral components well integrated

Soave Classico, Inama, 2011, Verona, **Italy** 35
Light yellow color, elegant nose of chamomile, elder flower, iris. Flavors of pineapple, apricot & peach with sweet almond on the finish

Assyrtiko, Sigalas, 2011, Santorini, **Greece** 38
Straw-blond with light shades of green. Subtle nose of citrus fruit. Excellent structure, full-bodied mineral character with crisp acidity & long aftertaste.

Pinot Blanc, Dopff & Irion, 2010, Alsace, **France** 28
Often called chardonnays understudy, pinot blanc is crisp and soft, backed with bone-dry acidity. Green apple, green plums, it's all about freshness

Grenache Blanc, Camp Four, "Epiphany" 2011, Santa Barbara, **CA** 39
refreshing aromas of white nectarine, apricot, anise and white flowers on the nose. Flavors of nectarine, white peach, grapefruit, apricot and Asian pear combine on the palate to make this a truly food friendly wine.

Saint Joseph Blanc, Domaine Faury, 2010, Rhone **France** 52
Blended with mostly Marsanne and a touch of Roussanne, its complex, smoky nose gives way to hints of blooming white flowers. The texture is out of this world; luscious, succulent, and reminiscent of ripe peaches.

Chateauneuf-du-Pape Blanc, Chateau La Nerthe, 2010, Rhone, **France** 78
This wine is made from a blend of Rousanne (about 40%), Grenache Blanc (about 25%) and the remainder Clairette and Bourboulenc. 40% of the wine is fermented in old oak barrels. Pleasantly aromatic, with subtle gooseberry notes, white flowers and herbal tea

Rioja Blanco, Muga, (Viura 90%, Malvasia 10%), 2010, Rioja, **Spain** 38
Straw yellow with glints of burnished gold. On the nose this wine primarily displays fruity aromas of ripe pineapple, peaches in syrup and honey. It has a full, juicy, velvety attack and certainly no vestiges of its time on fine lees

Albariño, Orballo, 2010/11, Rias Baixas, **Spain** 45
Generous on the palate with a weighty leesy texture, ripe fruit and minerality all balanced by a refreshing smack of acidity

Chenin Blanc, Ken Forester, Reserve, 2010, Stellenbosch, **South Africa** 39
This wine is a great example of the harmonious balance which can be achieved between fruit and delicate oak-vanilla flavor

Chenin Blanc, Marc Bredif, 2010/11, Vouvray, Loire Valley, **France** 38
Pale gold-yellow in color. The wine has a subtle attack on the palette and a fresh structure with an aromatic finish

White Blend, "Conundrum", 2010, **California** 52
Clear, light brass color. Intriguing aromas, remarkably complex; apples, figs, oranges, a hint of oak; brown spices like nutmeg and cinnamon mingle with dark, leafy fresh herbs. Just off-dry, fruit sweetness nicely balanced by crisp acidity

Originated in the Loire Valley of France. However, New Zealand has taken this grape to new heights in the cool Marlborough region, producing racy wines with tropical fruit and gooseberry flavors. Sauvignon Blanc is usually a dry white wine with distinctive herbaceous qualities

Pinot Noir is Burgundy's most famous Noble grape. Known and loved as "Red Burgundy" in much of the world, Pinot Noir can be among the most elegant wines coming out of France. Flavors are reminiscent of sweet red berries, plums, tomatoes, cherries and at times a notable earthy or wood-like flavor, depending on specific growing conditions.

Up-front wine with good balance and character. Dried cherries, wild herbs and worn-in leather
- M. Chapoutier, "Petite Ruche"**, 2008, Crozes-Hermitage, **France** 45
Deep purple-red, aromas of red fruits, blackcurrant and raspberry. Fresh and round tasting on the palate, with a finish of stewed fruits all in finesse
- Domaine du Gour de Chaule, "Cuvee Tradition"**, 2007, Gigondas, **France** 50
Pliant bitter cherry and dark berry flavors offer impressive depth and a lightly chewy texture

"Vivid purple with aromas of raspberry, blackberry, dried violet, anise & cinnamon. Sweet red and dark berry flavors and a dusting of Asian spices

Richly layered, with linzer torte & boysenberry notes gliding together, backed by anise, violet & graphite on the long, fine-grained finish

96 % syrah, 4% Viognier. Aromas and flavors of black pepper, spice, licorice and game. It is one of the great wines of the world
- Ferraton Pere & Fils, "Hermitage"**, Les Miaux 2006, Rhone, **France** 96
Powerful and fleshy wine with smooth tannins, aromas of ripe black fruit. Long lasting and persisting wine

Merlot & Right Bank Bordeaux (Lighter bodied to full bodied)

The classic Merlot grape originated from the Bordeaux region of France. It typically produces a soft, medium-bodied red wine with juicy fruit flavors. A range of fresh flavors such as plums, cherries, blueberries and blackberries mixed with cocoa and black pepper tones, often dominate this type of red wine. The tannin levels are typically lower than say a Cab and the fruit flavors are typically forward

Cabernet Sauvignon & Left Bank Bordeaux (Medium to full bodied)

Originally from Bordeaux, with a substantial foothold in California. Medium-bodied to full-bodied and are characterized by their high tannin content which serves to provide structure and intrigue while supporting the rich fruit characteristics. The flavor profile includes plum, cherry, blackberry, blueberry, warm spice, vanilla, tobacco and sometimes leather aromas and or flavors.

- Tempranillo**, Muga, "Reserva", 2007, Rioja, **Spain** 45
70% Tempranillo, 20% Garnacha, 10% Mazuelo and Graciano. 6 months traditional Riojan oak vats, 24 months in oak barrels & 12 months in the bottle
- Tempranillo**, Dehesa, "La Granja", 2004, Castilla y Leon, **Spain** 52
Purity of fruit accompanies concentrated texture and weight, with excellent balance and expression enhanced by two years in bottle prior to release
- Malbec**, Bodegas Salentein, "Killka", Mendoza, **Argentina** 34
Purplish red colour. In the nose, it displays aromas reminiscent of plums and blackberries with a hint of vanilla granted by its oak ageing. In the mouth, it is a fruity wine with very good structure and silky tannins.
- Malbec**, Cuvelier Los Andes, "Coleccion", 2008/09, Mendoza, **Argentina** 54
The deep purple-colored has a stunning aromatic display of pain grille, mineral, espresso, black cherry, and black raspberry. Serious depth and concentration
- Malbec**, Susana Balbo, 2009, Mendoza, **Argentina** 45
Beautiful deep violet color with exploding aromas of blackberry, black cherry and violets framed by hints of oak and mint. Ripe plum fruit and a hint of toasty vanilla, bittersweet chocolate and a hint of mint on the finish
- Garnacha**, Zestos, 2011, Vinos de Madrid, **Spain** 27
Produced from 40-50 year old dry-farmed vineyards, 2,850 feet in elevation. Aging is 100% unoaked. Lots of kirsch, strawberry, black currant and licorice aromas jump from the glass of this medium-bodied, richly fruity, surprisingly intense red.
- Chianti Classico**, Tenuta di Coltibuono, "Cultus Boni", 2007, Tuscany, **Italy** 48
Perfect balance from a relatively young but mature Chianti Classico. Delicious dark red fruits, good tannic backbone and refreshing acidity
- Vino Noble di Montepulciano**, 2007, Villa Sant'anna, Montepulciano, **Italy** 63
Bright ruby red. Intense and fine bouquet of black cherries, violet, blackcurrants, mint. Nice and well balanced structure
- Brunello di Montalcino**, Caparzo, 2007, Montalcino, **Italy** 65
Garnet red, intense and brilliant with light orange hints. The palate is dry, warm, full-bodied, harmonious, delicate and austere
- Barolo, Brovia, "Rocche"**, 2005, Piedmonte, **Italy** 125
The nose is balanced and intense with violets, strawberries, prunes, cherries, mint, woody essence, liquorice and some balsamic notes. The taste begins slowly, but it grows incrementally until coating the palate
- Amarone della Valpolicella, Tommaso Bussola**, 2006, Veneto, **Italy** 89
There is slight sweetness or chewiness and the finish is marked by thick cherry and blackberry flavors
