*Greco di Tufo, Dei Feudi di San Gregorio (Campania) 2003*

*This white wine, made from the ancient grape variety Greco di Tufo, is one of the most unique in all of Italy. Exotic aromas of ripe apricots, ferns, and mint leads to a harmonious palate and a long fruity and fresh finish.*

*Rosso di Montepulciano, Daviddi (Tuscany) 2002*

*This baby Brunello has fresh aromas of raspberry and strawberry, and is round, ripe and velvety on the palate with a fresh and energetic finish.*

*Primitivo, Tormaresca*

*(Puglia) 2001*

*This single vineyard Italian Zinfandel delivers full bodied, spicy ripe red fruit and earthy, woody notes with a hint of anise typical of primitivo. Perfect with hearty pastas, and grilled meats.*

*Borgonero, Borgo Scopeto (Tuscany) 1999*

*This unique Super Tuscan blend of Sangiovese, Cabernet, and Shiraz, is a fleshy, full bodied and complex wine. Flavors of plum, cedar, blackberries, and toast predominate on the palate, with a subtle flavor of toasted nuts in the extended finish.*

*Barbaresco, Rabaja, Cortese (Piedmont) 1999*

*This single vineyard unfiltered wine is 100% Nebbiolo grown, it has plenty of blackberry, tobacco, and floral aromas. Full-bodied, with firm yet velvety tannins and long caressing finish.*

*Barolo, Marchesi di Barolo (Piedmont) 1999*

*This wine is immediately pleasing and sumptuous. It has scents of intense rose, licorice, and spice lead to mouth filling, full bodied and complex flavors on the palate. This is a great example of the “new age” Barolo: ready to drink at an early age yet displaying the great complexity and promise of top-rate Nebbiolo.*
